

There are important Correctional Institution rules that must be followed when visiting inside prisons. It is important to always follow these guidelines, as well as the **Champions for Life** Do's and Don'ts listed below. Should you have any comments or questions regarding these guidelines, please write them down. A **CFL** staff member will gladly discuss these concerns with you. Remember, "Blessed are the flexible, for they shall not be bent out of shape."

DO

1. Attend ALL scheduled meetings, banquets, activities. Arrive on time and stay for the entire event.
2. Be familiar with the **Champions for Life** materials and Teammate Packet contents; Schedules, Evangelism tract, Study Guides, Evaluations, Waivers, etc.
3. Wear casual clothing. No shorts, tank tops, open toed shoes, or inappropriate attire. Your Coordinator will advise you on any other clothing restrictions at your assigned facility.
4. Tell your Coordinator if you have medication or health issues that need special attention.
5. Respect ALL authority. Immediately obey instructions from Prison Staff and your Coordinator.
6. Relax, mingle with the inmates and be yourself. Never argue. Listen twice as much as you talk.
7. Ask before entering an inmates living area or sitting on their furniture. This is their home.
8. Eat with inmates when this is possible.
9. Share with Corrections officers/personnel when this does not interfere with their duties.
10. Complete ALL paperwork and turn it in to your Coordinator or Team Leader; Registration/Expense Form, Decision list, Evaluation forms, etc.

DON'T

1. Take Bibles larger than pocket size.
 2. Bring cameras, tape recorders, pagers, cellular phones, PDA's or any electronic devices.
 3. Bring ANY unnecessary items such as gum, extra clothing, billfolds, purses, knives, tools, etc. Your Coordinator will brief you on other prison concerns; tobacco, hats, jewelry, cash, etc.
 4. Give out your personal address or phone number.
 5. ARGUE with anyone, and do not RUN in or outside the facility.
 6. Criticize any "religion" or "lifestyle". Focus on presenting the Evangelism tract.
 7. TALK during Programs. Again, DO NOT TALK during programs.
 8. Comment on institution staff, food, housing, etc.
 9. Ask inmates about their crimes, and absolutely do not discuss the death penalty.
 10. Go into restricted areas or leave without approval from your Coordinator.
 11. Advise any inmate about medication they may be taking.
 12. Get involved financially with inmates.
 13. Make promises you will not keep.
 14. Pass out anything except the approved materials your Coordinator has given you.

Our PURPOSE and FOCUS during this **Bill Glass Champions Event** is BASIC EVANGELISM. We all agree on the way to Salvation, but we do not all agree on some "post graduate" issues. Areas of disagreement can cause confusion and division, thereby harming the cause of Christ. Therefore, such terms as "Baptized in the Spirit", "Slain in the Spirit", "Faith Healing", "Speaking in Tongues" and practices related to these terms, will not be used during any **Champions Event**. Although many of our Staff and Teammates normally use these terms, they have agreed to the **Champions for Life** philosophy and format. We leave these "post graduate" areas to the new believer, the Holy Spirit, and the Chaplaincy program at the facility. Thank you for reviewing these important guidelines. If you have any questions, please speak to a **CFL** staff member.

In addition to the TEAMMATES DO'S & DON'TS, which apply to all bikers, these MOTORCYCLES DO'S & DON'TS are extremely important. If you have any questions or comments, ask your Biker Team Leader or any **Champions for Life Staff** member. Thank you for your partnership with **Champions for Life**.

DO

1. Attend ALL Biker meetings. Your Biker Coordinator will advise you on the Game Plan and other important prison concerns; tobacco, hats, jewelry, tools, contraband, etc.
2. If you have any questions, ASK YOUR BIKER TEAM LEADER.
3. Ride safely. Remember, there are bikers with all different experience levels. Try not to ride too fast. If you are less experienced, please ride to the front. Arkansas Physics proves that if you are leading at 55mph, the last rider is doing 85mph to keep up!!
4. Stop before arriving at the prison to use a bathroom.
5. Remove all contraband items from your bike and yourself that are not allowed in the prison.
6. Bring a bag or container to store unapproved items. Put these items in a locked vehicle in the parking lot.
7. Have a picture I.D. Have it ready for the officer at the Sallyport (biker) gate.
8. Remain QUIET when being processed through Security gates. This may be the first time motorcycles have been allowed into the prison and the less confusion the better.
9. If you have any questions, ASK YOUR BIKER TEAM LEADER.
10. IMMEDIATELY OBEY all instructions from Prison Staff and **CFL** leaders.
11. Share your faith with inmates. If you must leave before you are finished sharing, turn the inmate over to one of the Teammates.
12. Complete ALL paperwork and turn it in to your Coordinator or Team Leader; Registration/Expense Form, Decision list, Evaluation forms, etc.

DON'T

1. RACE your bike in or outside the facility. Make all the noise you want, but do not speed.
 2. Perform "Wheelies" inside or outside the institution at any time.
 3. Criticize other "religions" or "lifestyles." Talk about Bikes and share the **Champions for Life** Evangelism Tract.
 4. TALK during Programs. Again, DO NOT TALK during programs.
 5. Pass out anything except the approved materials from your Coordinator.
